#### **HAVE A SAFE AND HAPPY CHRISTMAS**



#### Home security advice.

- Do you have presents under your Christmas tree?
- Can they be seen from a window?
- Don't give thieves an easy target.
- Keep windows and doors always secure.
- Keep presents and valuables out of sight.
- Dispose of all boxes and packaging carefully, particularly from expensive presents, and do not leave it on show outside the house.
- Security mark gifts and valuables with your postcode and house number.
- Register items using the free service: immobilise.com which enables police to identify the owner of valuables if they are stolen.

#### **Out shopping**

- If you are visiting the shops this Christmas, be careful how you leave your car.
- Do not leave valuables or shopping on display in your car.
- Close windows, sunroof, lock doors & activate security alarms when leaving your car.
- Park in a busy, well-lit area or secure car park if possible Visit http://www.parkmark.co.uk/for details of approved local car parks.
- Take valuables with you when you leave your car, eg: cash, credit cards, mobile phones, sat nav systems etc.
- Avoid going back to your car to leave your shopping part-way through your trip.
- If you have no choice, make sure valuables and shopping are locked in the boot; taking care no-one is watching you.
- Do not leave your bag unattended on your trolley whilst loading your car.

#### **Shopping online**

Choosing where you shop: If you are making a purchase from a website or person you don't know and trust, carry out some research first. Look online for reviews of the website or person you are buying from. If you are purchasing an item from an online marketplace, you can view the seller's feedback history before going ahead with the purchase. Payment method: Use a payment method that offers buyer protection, such as a credit card if you have one, as most major credit card providers will help you get your money back if the item is faulty or damaged, or if it never arrives

## Day of Visibility 22.11.2024 - Pollards Hill

The Antisocial Behaviour Team co-ordinated and led the Day of Visibility in the Pollards Hill Area on the Friday 22.11.2024.

The Day of Visibility comprised of Area one and two Below.

- 1, Area one: can be described an area around Pollards Hill Library and Surrounding Streets
  - 2, Area two can be described as an area around Mitcham Common.

ASB Team and VAWG Team: The Merton Council Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) Team had a public engagement stall in the New Horizon Centre alongside the Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) Team and engaged with members of the public inside the centre and outside of the centre, providing information and advise regarding ASB, VAWG, and the reassuring the importance of reporting matters to services.

The ASB Team patrolled the location and has reported multiple litter, fly tips, locations with alcohol and NOX canisters (24 reports).

The ASB Team engaged with residents and businesses in relation to ASB Street Drinking in the locality, identified one male street drinking at the bus stop which will lead to a Community Protection Warning and advised one male smoking cannabis to leave the area.

The ASB Team installed 19 PSPO signs relating to Alcohol related Antisocial behaviour.

**Kingdom PSPO Enforcement:** Patrolled the location and noted no street drinkers in the location during the patrol timeframes.

VIA- Drug and Outreach: Patrolled the area with the ASB Team and provided information relating to the identification of a street drinking male causing Anti-social behaviour in the locality.

**Homelessness and Outreach Services:** Patrolled the location and could not identify homeless persons in the locality.

**MET Police:** The Met Police had a public engagement stall and patrolled the area with the ASB Team. We advised a male playing amplified music outside a shop to turn his music down and engaged with businesses. One male has been identified street drinking in the locality that is known to services.

Youth Detached Team: The detached team patrolled the area in the evening and engaged with nine young people loitering and smoking cannabis. This engagement has led to six for Substance Misuse workshops.

Waste Enforcement: Placed no fly tipping signage, 1 Warning for Alcohol PSPO breach. 1 littering fixed penalty notice was issued on the day.

Parking Enforcement: 16 Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) have been issued on the day.

Private property Licencing: Carried out inspections for flats, in relation to disrepair and Licencing, HMOs. They identified 3 suspected unlicenced HMO currently being investigated.

They also identified properties with overcrowding, damp and mould, a leak in the roof and damage to a property.

#### **Reporting ASB**

The ASB Team encourage Antisocial Behaviour reporting to The ASB Team, and the MET Police, and Housing Associations.

## FIRE SAFETY TIPS THIS CHRISTMAS

- Check your Christmas tree lights carry the British Safety Standard sign.
- Never place candles near your Christmas tree or materials that can catch light easily.
- Test your smoke alarms at least monthly and only remove batteries when replacing them.
- Most fires start in the kitchen. Avoid leaving a cooker unattended.
- Avoid cooking when under the influence of alcohol.
- Make sure cigarettes are put out properly.
- Decorations can burn easily so don't attach them to lights or heaters.
- Keep candles, lighters and matches out of children's reach. Never leave burning candles unattended.
- Never overload electrical sockets. Always switch Christmas lights off and unplug them before you go to bed.
- Take care around open fireplaces as clothes may catch fire.
- Take time to check on older relatives and neighbours this Christmas as they are at greater risk from fire.
